

Workshop: Highway 11/17 Study Report.

Members of Council met in an informal workshop setting to review the Route Options for the proposed Highway 11/17 Bypass around the Village of Kakabeka falls.

It is always difficult to make choices that will undoubtedly cause hardships to those persons affected by change. In our case, by-passing the Village of Kakabeka Falls will reduce the number of tourists thereby affecting business opportunities and potential revenues. The flip side of this scenario is that a number of residential and farm properties could avoid the expropriation process and thereby maintain the current and future assessment base if the proposed four lanes was constructed north of the Village.

From a business prospective the question to answer is which route will have the least impact on the community. To address this question further information is required;

- 1) How much does the tourist trade contribute to the overall community of the Village of Kakabeka Falls?
- 2) How much assessment will be lost from the four lanes entering the north side of the Village?

Council is faced with making a decision on the route selection, in doing so; Council needs additional information that will answer the above noted questions.

Therefore Council should enact a resolution that would direct the CAO to correspond with three or four businesses within the Village obtain an answer to question one and further that a detailed assessment and property tax breakdown be prepared to answer question two.



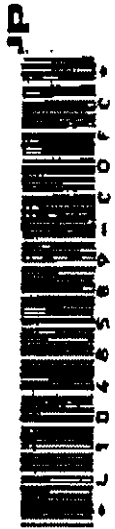
